He eventually rose to lead the Marine Band from 1880-1892 and established its prominence as "The President's Own." A renowned musician, he is known as "The March King" and the world's most widely played martial musician. John Philip Sousa

In 1942, during the battle for Guadalcanal, he single-handedly held off an overwhelming force of Japanese attackers. Manning a machine gun all night, he was largely responsible for U.S. forces holding the line around Henderson air field. As a result, he was awarded the Medal of Honor. He was later killed in action during the invasion of Iwo Jima in 1945. John Basilone

How does one earn the Legion of Merit? Exceptional Meritorious conduct in the performance of outstanding services and achievements

How does one earn the Bronze Star? It is awarded to any person who, while serving in any capacity in or with any branch of the Armed Forces after 6 December 1941, distinguishes themselves by heroic or meritorious service or achievements.

How does one earn the Purple Heart? By being wounded or killed in action against an enemy of the United States or as a result of an act of any such enemy or opposing Armed Forces.

What document defines the Marine Corps mission? National Security Act of 1947, as amended in 1952.

What are the seven elements of the Marine Corps mission? Provide Fleet Marine Forces in the seizure or defense of naval bases and for the conduct of land operations, Provide detachments and organizations for service on armed vessels of the Navy and security detachments for the protection of naval stations and bases, Develop, in coordination with the Army, Navy, and Air Force, the doctrine, tactics, techniques, and equipment employed by landing forces amphibious operations, Provide Marine forces for airborne operations, in coordination with the Army, Navy, and Air Force, according to the doctrine established by the Joint Chiefs of Staff, Develop, Expand peacetime components to meet wartime needs.

Identify and describe the three principle subdivisions of the Marine Corps organization. 1. Fleet Marine Forces assigned to the Operating Forces of the Navy; 2. Marine Corps security forces assigned to shore activities of the Navy; and, 3.
